

What an exciting, eventful month supporting literacy initiatives for both children and adults in Palm Beach County!



Christmas at Sea: In July we sent 21 knitted hats and 16 knitted scarves to Christmas at Sea Headquarters. These were all knitted by Jean Allen. Gay Alexin knitted 1 scarf and Jean has knitted 29 additional hats and 11 scarves which will be sent this week. I am sure this will make lots of seamen very happy and warm!



Operation Christmas Child/Samaritan's Purse: We delivered a grand total of 52 shoe boxes this year. Way to go ladies!





Free the Girls: We collected and sent to headquarters in Indiana, 36 bras and 11 camisoles.

Shot @ Life: We donated \$50 to UN Foundation [Shot@Life](#) Campaign.

Donation to Guatamalan Maya Center: We collected and delivered food, frying pans, baby wipes and baby formula to families in need due to Hurricane Dorian.

Heifer International: Our donation of \$50 will gift a Hope Basket which includes rabbits and a starter flock of chickens.

They have 45 plus children and try to make sure each child gets a few presents. When we donate our gifts to the girls it helps them to be able to insure all of the children in their care have a wonderful Christmas.
